In 2014 we once again set new records for breakfasts served. However, the working conditions in the kitchen were significantly better than in previous years thanks to the upgrades we made in 2013.

There is a significant new look to Morden. We have several young families that have settled in our community over the past couple of years and that is very good for Morden. This park will be constructed in the west side of Grave Park, right across the street from the community centre. Board member Robert Zehr and resident Travis Roberts have spent an enormous amount of time researching and drafting the plans for this 'natural' playground, the first of its kind in Kings County. We have applied for grants to fund the capital costs from both Kings County and the Province.
